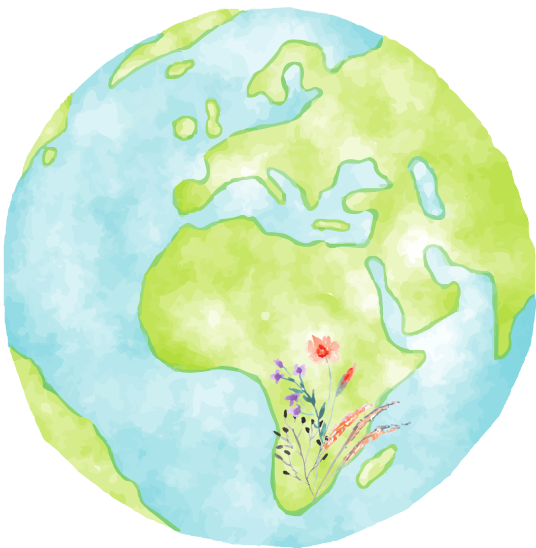

THE BIG "WHY"



Our increasingly urban lifestyles have resulted in a widespread **human-nature disconnect** which is believed to play a key role in our slow response and reluctant action to challenges such as climate change, deforestation and pollution. In order to address these environmental issues, we need to encourage the formation of a relationship between humans and nature. This relationship, often termed *nature connectedness*, can become engrained in our environmental identity if formed before the age of eleven. Our mission at the Kinship Programme is to **encourage children to develop a relationship with nature** and a **desire to champion conservation** both now and later in life.

WORKSHOP ITINERARY AND CONTENT

Day One: Understanding the Child

This morning will be spent considering the needs of the child, the purpose of education, and basic principles of the Montessori philosophy

Day Two: Earth Stewardship

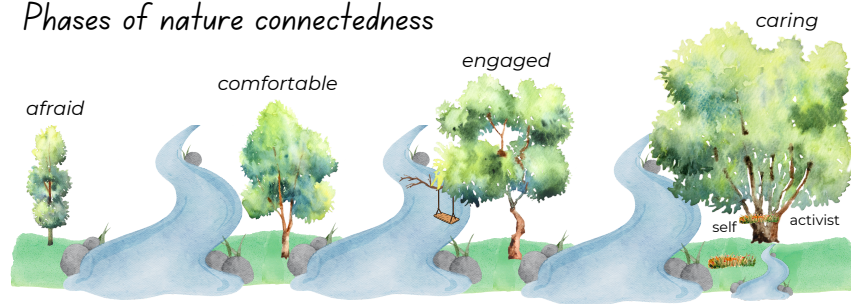
